His new album, *The Heat* (Mercury), is his best so far, following his disappointing Niles Rogers-produced sophomore effort and his now-acknowledged classic first LP. Although he's a certified U.S. male (and an incredibly handsome one at that), and although he's got an absolutely huge following in England (No. 1 hits, arena concerts, the whole nine yards), he's yet to find the same success at home. Reed and his band, Network, could easily fill a Forum-sized venue in England; at least we Yankees can still enjoy him in a club like the Roxy. And, no, Dan will not be appearing "nude" tonight. ■ For all the movie fans who've shaken their heads in disbelief when Joan Crawford or June Allyson burst into onscreen song, this revue will answer a lot of questions and provide singular boffo entertainment. Three vocalists who made their living as unbilled singing voices — India Adams (who covered for Crawford and Cyd Charisse); the Les Brown band's girl singer, JoAnn Greer (that's her, not Rita Hayworth, singing "Bewitched" in *Pal Joey*); and Annette Warren (the gorgeous voice you hear coming from Ava Gardner's mouth in *Showboat*) — assemble for a unique show featuring film clips of the star performances these gals dubbed, some wry reminiscing and a whole lot of songs. With such first-rate material (e.g., "Can't Help Lovin' That Man," "Two Faced Woman," "Tenderly," "That's Entertainment"), and these obviously talented singers, there's much more to this than mere multimedia camp concept: it's also an intriguing look at hidden movie history. Coming first hand, as it does, makes it all the more enthralling. (Jonny Whiteside)

■ Many folks have a hard time with Kyuss. They either think they're the greatest thing since sliced bread, or they actively hate them. But that's a good thing. It shows that Kyuss has something 95 percent of the competition is lacking: originality. And another rare trait: confidence in their own individuality and vision. In fact, their vision is so powerful, it borders on a sort of mystic spirituality, as do their cryptic lyrics. With a bludgeoning, fuzzed-out, low-tuned, early Sabbath-style guitar attack, a rock-solid rhythm section and the off-in-his-own-world/Buddha-descending-from-the-mountaintop vocal style of John Garcia, these young upstarts from the Godforsaken secluded land of Palm Desert are going somewhere. I once saw them kick the asses of the headlining band with whom they shared the bill. Look for their soon-to-be-released debut longplayer, and attend this show. You won't be sorry. (Scott Morrow)
