

Highways Performance Space is Southern California's boldest center for new performance. In its 34th year, Highways continues to be an important alternative cultural center in Los Angeles that encourages fierce new artists from diverse communities to develop and present innovative works.

Highways promotes the development of contemporary socially involved artists and art forms. Our mission is implemented through four programs (the performance space, workshop/university program and two galleries). Annually, we co-present approximately 250 performances by solo dramatic artists, small theater groups, dance companies and spoken word artists; we curate and exhibit approximately 12 contemporary visual art exhibits per year with work that explores the boundaries between performing and visual art forms; we commission and premiere new work by outstanding performing artists; organize special events, curate festival, offer residency and educational programs that engage community members in the arts while providing access to professionally-directed instruction.

Artistic Director, Leo Garcia: "I'm aligned with Highways' commitment to diversity, to the development of new works, to the exploration of new forms of performance, and to our First Amendment Right of free expression. At Highways we contribute to culture and society by affecting progressive change through performance. I will continue to facilitate artistic expression in a supportive, non-elitist, non-dogmatic way.
